

Dawn Champion, the British Pilgrimage Trust

Dawn Champion is a historian, naturalist and pilgrim. After a career with English Heritage and the Wildlife Trusts, she now works for the British Pilgrimage Trust as Head of Community, reviving a culture of

pilgrimage and helping more people discover the benefits of this modern practice built on ancient tradition.

Dr Renie Chow Choy

Dr Renie Chow Choy is Associate Lecturer in Church History at Westcott House, Cambridge, and from January will be Public Historian at Westminster Abbey. Previously she was Community Engagement Manager for historic collections at St Paul's Cathedral, where she led the curation of two trails about monuments associated with the British Empire. Renie is author of *Ancestral Feeling: Postcolonial Thoughts on Western Christian Heritage* (SCM Press 2021) and *Intercessory Prayer and the Monastic Ideal in the Time of the Carolingian Reforms* (Oxford University Press 2016), a monograph on early medieval monasticism. She sits on a number of committees responsible for the conservation and interpretation of the Church of England's historic buildings, including the Cathedrals Fabric Commission for England (CFCE). She is also Visiting Research Fellow at the University of Chester and Research Associate at the Centre for the Study of Christianity and Culture at the University of York.



Revd Professor Dee Dyas

Revd Professor Dee Dyas is Emeritus Professor of the History of Christianity and former Director of the Centre for Christianity & Culture at the University of York. She has taught spirituality, led

research on cathedrals, mission, and pilgrimage, worked extensively with the AEC and cathedrals across the country on visitor engagement, and is Director of the Explore Project. Dee is now part of the team delivering 'Faith in the North,' a new mission, pilgrimage, and heritage project for cathedrals and parish churches across the Northern Province.
