



Lydia is the Ministry Leader for the Church's *Ministry of Healing* in Ireland. This charity, founded in 1932, works to resource the Church of Ireland in healing ministry and in creating spaces for all to find rest and open themselves to God's healing love. Lydia will lead a 'shortened' version of the *Sacred Pause*, focusing on spending time in nature and returning to a sense of ourselves and of God's presence with us.

GUEST SPEAKERS





The Revd Dr Alex Wimberly is Leader of the *Corrymeela* Community in Northern Ireland. Corrymeela was founded in 1965 as a way of building a more peaceful Northern Ireland through Christian community. *Corrymeela* continues to work alongside people of all faiths and none to live out reconciliation in our daily lives. Alex is a minister originally from the United States. His doctorate from the University of Notre Dame examined themes of reconciliation in the American Presbyterian Church. Alex is married to Kiran, also an ordained minister, who is currently serving with the Moravian Churches in Northern Ireland.



The Revd Abigail Sines has recently been appointed Dean of Clonmacnoise. She was Associate Minister in the Carrigrohane Union of Parishes since September 2022. Her responsibilities there focused on children and family ministry in the parish and creative outreach centred on the Church of the Resurrection, Blarney. She initiated the *Mindful Makers* craft group. From March 2024, the group took on an ambitious project: creating a knitted Bible display, which made its debut in Blarney during Holy Week this year, drawing hundreds of visitors from the local area and beyond. This is on display in Christ Church Cathedral for us to see. Abigail previously served as Dean's Vicar in Christ Church Cathedral from September 2016 to August 2022. She is a member of the Church of Ireland's Liturgical Advisory Committee and the Commission for Christian Unity and Dialogue, serving as the convenor for the Interfaith Working Group. She is a trustee of *Places of Sanctuary Ireland* and the *Church Mission Society Ireland*.



Kelley Bermingham is the Community Officer and Safeguarding DLP (Child and Adult) at Saint Patrick's Cathedral, Dublin. As a social care worker, Kelley has formal training in social care, community work, mental health, youth work, and facilitation. Kelley also has a long history of voluntarism, beginning at home, where the A.L.O.N.E. organisation was started by her parents. Active involvement in the Irish Red Cross, the annual Kildare Derby Festival, Kilmainham Arts Festival, Community Radio, and youth mentoring are examples of the breadth of approaches to community connection and activity. Kelley is elected as a Representative on the Public Participation Network, sitting on the Local Community Development Committee for Dublin City, as well as holding a seat on the Secretariat for Dublin City.



Map of Dublin (Conference Area)






